Monetary Policy Transparency

- FOMC meets 8* times a year and releases materials on a set schedule
 - 2 weeks prior to the meeting
 - Beige Book
 - At completion of the meeting
 - Policy statement
 - Press conference
 - Summary of Economic Projections
 - Minutes (3 week delay)
 - 5 years later
 - Individual Economic Projections
 - Tealbooks
 - Transcripts and presentation materials

 - The Philadelphia Fed publishes the <u>Livingston Survey</u>, the oldest continuous survey of economists' expectation, since 1946



Markets



The New York Fed operates the System's markets trading desk. Its web site features:

- Markets Data Hub
- System Open Market Account (SOMA) Portfolio
- <u>Survey of Primary Dealers</u> (released about 3 weeks after FOMC meeting)
- <u>Survey of Market Participants</u> (released about 3 weeks after FOMC meeting)
- Markets Data APIs

Other FR Banks may operate special facilities and publish related data.

✓ Fed in Print (index of the Fed's publications, from economic newsletters and annual reports to scholarly publications and speeches) fedinprint.org

- Working papers
 - Topic-specific series, e.g. finance, payments, community development
 - General economics topics
- "Economic Review" publications
 - Began as status reports from the 12 FR Banks, grew into journal-type publications in the 1970s
 - FRASER Blog: Federal Reserve Research Publications
 - Economic Review Publications of Federal Reserve Banks (as of 2019)
- Research data
