THE WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS:


- Paced by a 4.5 percent jump in energy prices, April's consumer price index (CPI) rose 0.5 percent, or 6.2 percent at an annual rate. Excluding energy prices, the CPI advanced at a 3.3 percent rate. Through the first four months of 2002, the CPI has risen at a 3.8 percent rate, 0.3 percentage points faster than the same period a year earlier.
- Privately owned housing starts totaled 1,555,000 units at an annual rate in April, which was down 5.4 percent from March's rate and 9.3 percent below its first-quarter average of 1,715,000 units.
- In April, the index of industrial production rose 0.4 percent, or at a 4.7 percent annual rate. Industrial output has increased in four consecutive months, after falling in 14 of the previous 15 months. The manufacturing capacity utilization rate measured 73.9 percent in April, its highest reading in eight months.
- Following a 0.1 percent gain in March, retail and food services (R&FS) sales increased 1.2 percent in April. Excluding auto sales, R&FS sales were up 1 percent, the largest gain in three months. Year-to-date, non-auto R&FS sales have risen at a 9 percent annual rate, considerably stronger than the 3.6 percent rate of gain seen over the first four months of 2001.
- In March, the book value of business inventories fell 0.3 percent, the largest decline in three months. During the first quarter, total business inventories fell 0.6 percent. The current-dollar value of business inventories has not increased since the fourth quarter of 2000.

All data are seasonally adjusted unless otherwise indicated.


Adjusted Monetary Base



The adjusted monetary base is the sum of Federal Reserve deposits and vault cash held by domestic depository institutions, currency held by the public, and an adjustment for the effect of changes in reserve requirement ratios. The monetary base series includes Federal Reserve deposits used to satisfy clearing balance contracts. Data are computed by this bank. A detailed description of the adjusted monetary base is available from this bank. Recent data are preliminary.




Seasonally Adjusted



Adjusted reserves is the difference between the adjusted monetary base and the currency component of M1.



Currency Component of M1








Money Stock(M2) and Money Zero Maturity



M2 is the sum of M1, savings (including money market deposit accounts), small time deposits and retail money funds. Current data appear in the Federal Reserve Board's H.6 release.



Large Time Deposits and Retail Money Funds



Total Borrowings



Bank Loans and Credit


All Commercial Banks in the United States $^{1/}$



Commercial and Industrial Loans


